## Yardage and Pre-class instructions

Background 1 1/2 yards of dark solid (or appears solid)

A tone on tone, black with very small dots or designs, or perhaps a black, dark brown, or navy batik

Circles

Pick a one-yard cut of \*focal print that will show up well on your background. Then select 5 to 7 fat quarters or scraps that "read" as solids or non-print multicolors and can be cut into at least 14" circles. These should pick up the colors in your focal fabric.

ALL OF THESE **FABRICS MUST BE WASHED** BEFORE CLASS. IF YOU DO NOT PRE-WASH, YOUR FINISHED QUILT WILL HAVE OVAL SHAPES THE FIRST TIME IT IS WASHED!!!! ALL CUTTING WILL BE DONE IN CLASS!!!

## **Supplies**

X	sewing machine in good working order with manual
X	thread to match - grey or neutral work well for quilt piecing.
X	bobbins pre-wound with the above thread
X	extra machine needles
X	rotary cutter
X	rotary mat
X	acrylic ruler - 24" length is best
X	fabric scissors
X	seam ripper (for un-sewing!)
X	1/4" foot if available
X	Circle Around - Book (available at class time) \$16.98
