Fabric	Exact amount	Suggested Yardage
A - F (six fabrics)	4" each	1/4 yd
G	17"	5/8 yd
Backing	21" square	
Batting	20" square	
Binding	3/8 yd	


Cutting Chart


Fabric	Strips	Strip size
A - F (six fabrics)	1 each	each 4" x width
G	6	2 3/4" x width

- Sew six strip sets, each with a 2 3/4" G plus a spoke fabric (A,B,C,D,E,F).
- Mark the angled line on the 12 degree wedge tool. (See following page for the diagram.)
- An accurate wedge cut is important. To keep the wedge from slipping, place a tube of wide packaging tape onto the back of the wedge toolsticky side out.
- Cut five wedges from each strip set.
- 2 3/4" G 4" A Cut 5 wedges


Repeat for the other strip sets, cutting 5 wedges each.


- Pin the wedges together matching tips and wide ends. Be careful not to stretch the bias edges.
- Sew two wedges together, matching both the tip and wide ends.
- Sew the 30 wedges together to form a circle.
- Stabilize the center opening by ironing a scrap of freezer paper to the back side.
- Using the circle on the next page, create a freezer paper applique.
- Applique the circle over the center opening.
